## 1-2 DAY STAY IN MOUNTMELLICK (SUITABLE FOR FAMILIES)

## DAY 1

#### Morning



Start your day with a self-catering home cooked breakfast at the Forum. Alternatively, enjoy a full Irish Breakfast at Noras Café (The Square) or at The Hare Corners Restaurant, known for its delicious award-winning food and renowned for their friendly atmosphere. These are both short walking distances from the Forum.

The morning could begin with a scenic drive through the County Laois countryside, eventually reaching Castleview Open Farm, Barrack quarter, Cullihill, County Laois R32 E932 3-minutes' drive from Mountmellick. <u>https://castleviewopenfarm.ie/</u>

Upon arrival at the farm, you are greeted by the warm hospitality of the Saunders family who operate the farm. Stepping inside the farm, children can avail of the indoor play areas. There is a mud kitchen where children can unleash their creativity, crafting culinary masterpieces from mud and sticks. An imaginary play area allows them to transform into farmyard characters, while the electric go-karts provide a thrilling race around a designated track.

As lunchtime approaches, the aroma of freshly baked goods wafts from the onsite café, which offers which offers Coffee, tea, ice cream, Milkshakes, Sweet treats, and a range of hot food including Burgers, Vegetarian Burgers, Chicken selects, Cocktail Sausages and Chips. This outing is ideal for bringing a picnic basket.

#### Afternoon



After lunch, it's time to explore the extensive outdoor area. A network of walkways winds its way past paddocks teeming with domesticated wildlife. Spot giant rabbits with fur as soft as velvet, and majestic alpacas with their calming presence. Briana, the resident Eagle Owl, hoots from her perch, her amber eyes glinting curiously.

The afternoon could wind down with a visit to the farmyard petting zoo. Here, children can cautiously interact with a pot-bellied pig, stroke the fur of a friendly goat, or chase after fluffy ducks waddling across the yard. No trip to Castleview Open Farm is complete without tackling the challenging maze.

Notes: Families could easily spend a day or most of the day here. If you still have time to do something else, the 15-minute drive from Castleview Open Farm to The Dove Sensory Gardens, Abbeyleix is worthy of a visit. ### Morning

#### Afternoon



Pack a picnic with food to feed the ducks and take a 15-minute drive from Mountmellick to Emo Court, a stunning neo-classical mansion designed by the renowned architect James Gandon (1743-1823), famous for his great public building, including The Customs house Dublin, and the Four Courts in Dublin, Ireland. Enjoy a family walk in Emo Court gardens and parklands and join the children feeding the ducks. Picnic benches are provided or enjoy a lunch or coffee with a pastry in Emo Court tea rooms. Guided tours are available during the summer to discover the history of the once-powerful family and marvel at the opulent interiors.
